Dear Residents,

As many of you know the Clyman, Lowell, and Reeseville Fire Departments and the First Responders have been in the process of merging and becoming one department. We are writing you this letter to inform you that the merge will officially happen as of January 1st, 2022. The departments will now be collectively known as the CLR Fire and Rescue Department. This has been a process that has been in the works since 2016. It has taken a great deal of discussion, as well as collaboration with all the municipalities involved, and the leaders and members of each department. Many people have wondered what these changes mean for them. As far as EMS and fire coverage goes, nothing will change. We are already paged out simultaneously when there is a call and that will continue to happen. This prevents delay in response, should you have an emergency. We will still operate out of all three stations, as we do now. By merging, this will also allow us to utilize equipment that we may have multiple of by using them at one of the other stations.

As for the budget, there was a CLR Governing Group created that will oversee the financial side of the department. This committee has representation from the Townships of Portland, Elba, Clyman and Lowell as well as the Villages of Reeseville, Lowell and Clyman. The committee has been working hard alongside of the three Fire Chiefs to ensure the budget meets the needs of the department and that the process moving forward is a smooth transition for each municipality involved.

The CLR Governing Group also created a Fire Commission to oversee the Department personnel. The committee selected Dave Beal as the commission President. Dave had previously been the President of the three Fire Commissions that oversaw the individual departments. With this transition, the three Fire Commissions will be retired, and the newly created CLR Fire Commission will oversee the new department.

The Fire Commission has decided to keep all current fire officers in their positions they currently hold. The only change will be the Chiefs from each department. Eric Howlett was selected to be the Chief of the new CLR Fire and Rescue Department. John Neu and Chris Abell, the current Chiefs of Lowell and Reeseville, will be Deputy Chiefs of the CLR Fire & Rescue Department.

In closing, this has been a challenge that no one wanted to really address, but with the decline in new members wanting to join, people not having the time to serve their community like they did in the past, and the trend of smaller communities' populations shrinking, this merger needed to happen in order to meet current NFPA requirements, as well as utilizing each other's resources. Should you have any questions, feel free to give one of the officers below a call at any time or attend a meeting to address any concerns you have.

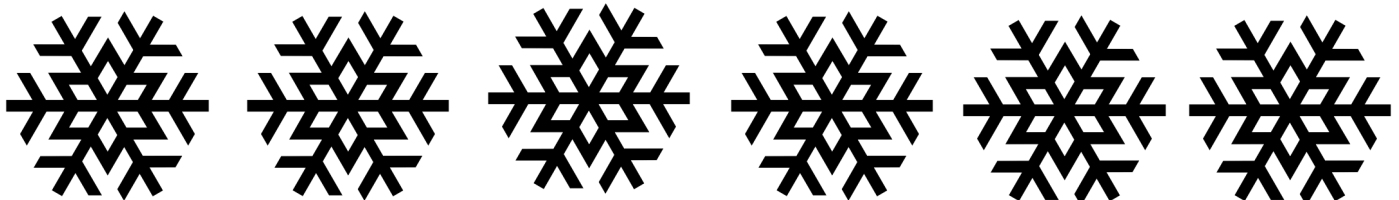
