
 Through the month of December, we will be collecting hats, gloves and scarves for donation to a local school district. If you would like to donate towards this collection, please reach out and let me know.



October 31.2022

A Special Meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Reeseville, Dodge County, Wisconsin, was held in open session on Monday, October 31, 2022 and called to order by President, Brian Miller at 6:30 p.m. The pledge of allegiance was recited. The following Trustees were present: Cheryl Goodrich, Margaret Schmidt, and Dave Snow. There is one vacancy.

Notice of this meeting was given to the public at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by posting the complete agenda at the Reeseville Village Hall, the Reeseville Post Office and on the Village's website.

A discussion was had in regards to Lifestar EMS renting out a bay for an ambulance. Lifestar has a third unit they would like to keep close, they looked at the bay and would like to rent it out. Discussed rent \$150 per month due on the first of the month starting December 1, 2022. A motion was made by Dave Snow and seconded by Cheryl Goodrich. Motion carried.

The Board worked as a committee on the 2023 budget. After working on resources expended and resources provided, the tax levy was set at \$176,000.

A budget hearing date was set for November 28, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.

A motion was made by Cheryl Goodrich and seconded by Margaret Schmidt that the meeting be adjourned. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:47 p.m.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF REESEVILLE November 10, 2022

A duly convened meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Reeseville, Dodge County, Wisconsin, was held in open session on November 10, 2022 and called to order by Village President, Brian Miller, at 6:30 p.m. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and the following Trustees were present: Debby Casperson, Cheryl Goodrich, Margaret Schmidt, and David Snow. Jim Bublitz was absent. There is one Trustee vacancy.

Notice of this meeting was given to the public at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by posting the complete agenda at the Reeseville Village Hall, the Reeseville Post Office, and on the Village's official website.

Anna Volkova was present to introduce herself to the Board, Dave Snow motioned to approve Anna for the vacant Trustee position, Debby Casperson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Fred Prough was preset for public comment, he lives on Jackson Street and noticed several nicks on the sidewalk and would like to have it fixed in the spring. Don Neitzel with Kunkel Engineering Group was also present, he will take a look at the sidewalks.

There was a motion by Debby Casperson and seconded by Margaret Schmidt to approve the consent agenda.

Engineer's report and update: Don Neitzel from Kunkel Engineering Group was present to give the update on the Jackson Street project. Top soil, seed, shoulder guard rail need to be finished, should be done by next week. Discussion was had on painting the street now or in the spring, it was decided spring would be better. LaLonde Contractors have requested payment #2 in the amount of \$430,343.07. They will go through and do a punch list of what needs to be completed, and leave the contract open to complete painting in the spring. Watertown in coming Thursday to clean the streets, they will bill Reeseville and we in turn will bill LaLonde.

There was a motion made by David Snow and second by Debby Casperson to proceed to pay request #2 to LaLonde Contractors. Motion carried

Lt. Robbie Weinfurter was present to give the Police report. There is a meeting scheduled November 18th to discuss nuisance properties. The police will notify residents they have 30 days to clean up followed by a written citation.

CLR Fire & Rescue had 268 calls this year. There is a meeting scheduled for November 16th to accept ARPA funding to start building in the spring. Deby Casperson motioned and Cheryl Goodrich seconded the motion to give CLR permission to build on 208 S Main St. Motion carried.

There was nothing to report from the Residence Board.

The board reviewed the library report and budget year-to-date.

Dean Ziegel gave an update on the Utility Department. All equipment is running fine, well two was down two Sunday's ago, he got it up and running.

Dean Ziegel also reported for the Streets & Alleys Committee, the streets are in good condition, Thursday is the last day for leaf pick up, but he will check if needed again after that. Wednesday the Christmas lights go up on the poles. Dean is getting the John Deere tractors ready for snow season. The brush pile is closed for the season, Dave Snow is getting prices to have it chipped, there is too much to do by hand.

Discussion was had regarding approving Handicap and/or Senior Parking at the First United Church of Christ, Brian Miller will look into it further.

Dave Snow motioned and Margaret Schmidt seconded the motioned to renew the Dodge County Humane Society contract for \$1,500.00.

There was a motion by Deby Casperson and seconded by Cheryl Goodrich to approve provisional operator's license for Jennifer Zichme, and to approve a regular license pending background check.

Public Health & Welfare Committee meeting was cancelled due to no proper notice.

The concession stand at the park had a break in, a police report was filed. The lock was smashed and the doorway molding broken, everything is secured until spring.

Cheryl Goodrich distributed the Community Center Report, they are looking to get plumbing fixed this year and, in the spring, take bids for landscaping. Bingo is going well. There are three parties booked in December.

There was no update on prices and materials at this time from the Recreation Department.

The board discussed future agenda items.
