PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF REESEVILLE October 13, 2022

A duly convened meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Reeseville, Dodge County, Wisconsin, was held in open session on October 13, 2022 and called to order by Village President, Brian Miller, at 6:31 p.m. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and the following Trustees were present: Cheryl Goodrich, Margaret Schmidt, and David Snow. Jim Bublitz and Debby Casperson were absent. There is one Trustee vacancy.

Notice of this meeting was given to the public at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by posting the complete agenda at the Reeseville Village Hall, the Reeseville Post Office, and on the Village's official website.

The appointment to fill the Trustee vacancy was tabled.

There were no public comments or input.

There was a motion by Cheryl Goodrich and seconded by Margaret Schmidt to correct the minutes as there were typos; and approve the consent agenda items which include the minutes from the previous regular meeting on September 15, 2022, the Village Treasurer's Report, and the Utility Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

Engineer's report and update: Don Neitzel from Kunkel Engineering Group was unable to attend the meeting but sent an email with the remaining schedule for the Jackson Street project.

Chris Abell was present to give the CLR Fire & Rescue report, they received a \$17,000.00 grant from Beaver Dam Hospital and \$227,000.00 grant from the State for EMS. There have been 249 calls for the year, with 18 so far for this month. Discussion was had about the number of lift assist requests, as 3 of the Village of Reeseville calls last week for lift assists. CLR does not charge residents for this service. Discussion was had regarding using the old Police radios for the Fire Department, Jefferson County is going digital so the radios need to be reprogrammed.

There was nothing to report from the Residence Board. The police report was reviewed.

The board reviewed the library report and budget year-to-date.

Dean Ziegel gave an update on the Utility Department. All equipment is running fine, one well one scale went down one week and the other well one scale went the next week. Both were able to keep up with the excess water from the rain.

Dean Ziegel also reported for the Streets & Alleys Committee, the leaf equipment is running and ready to go.

Discussion was had regarding approving Handicap and/or Senior Parking at the First United Church of Christ.

There was a motion by Dave Snow and seconded by Margaret Schmidt to approve the mobile home license to RHP effective September 14, 2022, the date they purchased the property. Motion approved.

There was a motion by Dave Snow and seconded by Margaret Schmidt to approve the liquor license to Minn's effective October 13, 2022 pending review into the State Statues. Motion tabled.

Public Health & Welfare Committee meeting was cancelled due to no proper notice. All bulk garbage items were picked up.

There was nothing to report from the Public Property Committee.

Cheryl Goodrich distributed the Community Center Report, it was noticed that the Charter bill is high and the Center needs some maintenance work.

There was nothing to report from the Recreation Department.

The board discussed future agenda items.
