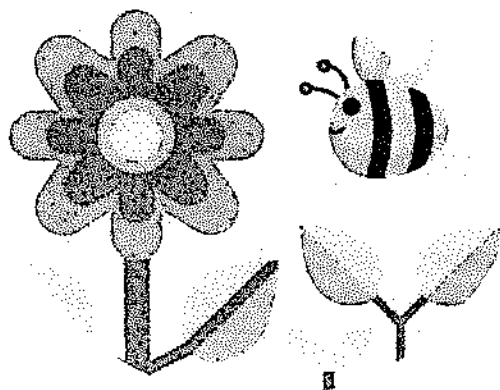
Sunday School for children ages 4 through 8 TH Grade meet from 10:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m.

As always, everyone who is reading these words is welcome to take part in any of the worship services, learning events and other activities held at our church. We hope to see you among us very soon!



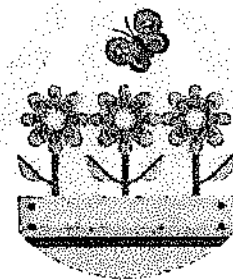
First United Church of Christ

PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD

OF THE VILLAGE OF REESEVILLE

FEBRUARY 9, 2023

A duly convened meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Reeseville, Dodge County, Wisconsin, was held in open session on February 9, 2023 and called to order by Village President, Brian Miller, at 6:35pm. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and the following Trustees were present" Cheryl Goodrich, Dave Snow, Anna Volkova. The following Trustee were absent Jim Bublitz and Debby Casperson.

Notice of the meeting was given to the public at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by posting the complete agenda at the Reeseville Village Hall, the Reeseville Post Office .

A letter of resignation from Christine Abell, dated February 6, 2023, was reviewed by the board. There was a motion by Dave Snow and seconded by Cheryl Goodrich to accept Christine's resignation from the Village Board, effective immediately. Motion carried.

The board tabled the vacant trustee position until March Board meeting, to give more time for anyone interested in the Trustee position.

There was a motion by Dave Snow and seconded by Cheryl Goodrich to approve the consent agenda, as presented with Margaret Schmidt just taking over Clerk/Treasurer position, and with Christine's resignation. Motion carried.

Don Neitzel and Tammy Hampton from Kunkel Engineering were not present do to the weather , Brian Miller talked with Don Neitzel regarding the sidewalk at 107 Jackson Street, and it was decided at the January 19th Board meeting after the Board reviewed photos and members visited the site location, that the general consensus of Board was that the chips appeared to be old and not due to the recent construction project.

The Board looked at the handicap ordinance and accordingly to ordinance 434.15 nothing will have to be changed, because the ordinance covers everything.

Officer Joseph Nicholas was present at the Board meeting; no current report was available. Dave Snow asked for a property maintenance update for March Board meeting. Dave Snow asked about radio for the squad and Officer Nicholas stated that the Sheriff wants the ok to go ahead with it, Dave Snow said that was approved at an earlier Board meeting, Officer Nicholas will forward that on to the Sheriff.

The Board reviewed the Lifestar EMS report. Lifestar will store a backup rig in the bay with police squad, and Lifestar will provide a letter signed and payment for utilizing the empty bay every month.

The Board reviewed the Dodge County ARPA Grant Agreement between CLR Fire and Rescue Group, Brian is in favor of proceeding, but would also want the Village Board to have say in moving forward with the plans and project, the Village Board members present were all in

agreement with moving forward with the project, and being involved as the plans are being worked out. A motion was made by Cheryl Goodrich and seconded by Anna Volkova to approve moving forward with the Dodge County ARPA Grant Agreement between CLR Fire and Rescue Group for the building project plans. Motion carried.

There was nothing to report from the Residence Board.

The Board reviewed the library reports, there was no further discussion.

Dean also gave an update on the utilities and stated no problems at this time.

Dean also gave update on the streets and alleys, and everything is good. The Board discussed parking on Jackson Street going out of town to the east, parking on the north side of the street up to the curve by Deans home will be the only parking in that area.

The Finance and Personnel committee will meet Wednesday February 15, 2023 at 4pm to discuss and open up application for the DPW position and Brush pile position

A motion by Anna Volkova and seconded by Dave Snow to revise resolution 1-2023 to 2 signatures for signing on bank accounts, Brian Miller President and Margaret Schmidt Clerk/Treasurer are the designated signers. Motion carried.

A motion by Dave Snow and seconded by Anna Volkova to hire temporary assistance Cheryl Goodrich and Darlene May to help Margaret Schmidt Clerk/Treasurer with the transition after Christine Abell resignation of Deputy Clerk. Motion carried.

The Board discussed public property at 502 South Main Street, no further action was taken.

Cheryl Goodrich gave the Community Center report, the board reviewed the report and no further discussion.

Recreation Department report, Dave Snow talked with Debby Casperson about an update on the playground equipment and the Watertown Health Foundation Grant, Debby had no new updates.

The board discussed future agenda items.

A motion to pay the bills was made by Dave Snow and seconded by Cheryl Goodrich, motion carried.
