

The site is located at the old burn site by the Sewer plant.







PROCEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD

OF THE VILLAGE OF REESEVILLE

May 11, 2023

A duly convened meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Reeseville, Dodge County, Wisconsin, was held in open session on May 11, 2023, and called to order by Village President, Brian Miller, at 6:30pm. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken and the following Trustees were present, Jim Bublitz, Cheryl Goodrich, Dave Snow, Anna Volkova, Kevin Hankes Jacob Pacala.

Notice of the meeting was given to the public at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by posting the complete agenda at the Reeseville Village Hall, the Reeseville Post Office.

Jim Bublitz made a motion to approve the consent agenda, with the following corrections, and was seconded by Kevin Hankes, motion cerried. Josh Braun asked if brush would be picked up from the curb, and the board informed no, but on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month brush may be taken out to the brush pile as long as you provide proof that you are a resident of the village, Joseph Wagner is the brush pile attendant who will be on site assisting residents. Dave Snow reported at the board meeting the Finance and Personal committee's suggestion to hire Kenneth Hankes. Dave Snow made a motion to hire Kenneth Hankes as the new DPW replacement for the village of Reeseville at the May board meeting the motion was seconded by Jim Bublitz, motion carried with Kevin Hankes abstaining from voting.

Public comment David Brown addressed the village board about noise complaint, and referenced the village ordinance regarding the noise issue, the board suggested talking with the neighbor regarding the concerns of noise and if that falls to work, then file a complaint with the police department.

Tammy Hampton from Kunkel Engineering group was present to update the board on a final pay request for the Jackson Street project, the village board addressed concerns regarding the seeding, the hydro muich. Jim Bublitz made a motion to withhold final payment contingent LaLonde Contractors Inc., come out and totally complete all incomplete items addressed, and the Village President and the committee chairman Jacob Pacala approve the final Inspection, motion was seconded by Kevin Hankes, motion carried. Tammy Hampton informed the board she is working on funding for the Garfield/Dewey project, and we may have to us different funding because Dewey Street, does not include water and sewer, Tammy will have more information at June board meeting.

Protections Persons Property-Safety, Martin Keberlein Introduced himself. The village had 27 incidents for the month, consisting or arrest, property maintenance and traffic. 27 hours were worked in April. Officer Keberlein also reported the sheriff department is short staffed and that is why the hours work were lower than normal. Officer Kerberlein discussed National Night Out which will be held August 1, 2023, and Officer Keberlein also thanked the donors Caine Warehouse, 4-H Group, CI Haase Vet for their generosity in donations. The committee will be having a committee meeting on May 25, 2023, at 6:30pm at Reeseville village hall.

Brian Miller reported that CLR held a meeting on May 10, and CLR was working on hiring Kunkel Engineering. Brian reported that it still wasn't decided if the building would be attached. Dave Snow questioned how would this work if the building is attached to municipal hall and having 2 different owners of each of the properties? Don Neitzel asked the board if the village is comfortable with Kunkel Engineering working for CLR, and the board feels it is to the boards adventage.

A motion was made by Kevin Hankes to move to item #10 on the agenda, the motion was seconded by Jacob Pacala, motion carried.

Donna from Dodge County Housing Authorities and Tom Langeria with PUB, RES Real Estate LLC were present and gave the board an update after meeting with the Finance and Personal Committee, Donna stated the Daycare could hold up to 45 children depending on staffing, a chain link fence would be installed, and the daycare would be open

to anyone with children in the age range. The housing units there would be 10 of them and they are rentals, and that background checks and screening are done on all applicants. These units are for all incomes. Jeff Caine was present and stated he is supportive of this project and has visited other locations in dodge county that have already got this up and running, and advised the board to go take a look for themselves. Tom Langeria explained more to the board about the Wisconsin Shares Program and how it all worked with the project. A motion was made by Cheryl Goodrich to move ahead with the concept PUB Agreement/PES Real Estate LLC, the motion was seconded by Kevin Hankes, a roll call vote was taken; Anna Volkova (yes), Cheryl Goodrich (yes), Dave Snow (NO), Jacob Pacala (yes), Kevin Hankes (yes), and Brian Miller (yes), motion carried.

Dave Snow reported he reached out to Rhyme Co. and Gordan Flesh for quotes on copier/printer and was waiting to hear back, discussion was tabled until next month.

Utilities report: Dean went over the Compliance Maintenance Report with the board. A motion by Cheryl Goodrich to approve Compliance Maintenance Report Resolution 2023-3, and seconded by Dave Snow, motion carried.

Dean went over Hawkins chemicals bill with the board, and said the village needs to bill back to specialty cheese 90% of the Hawkins bill. A motion by Jim Bublitz to bill back 90% to specialty cheese for Hawkin's chemicals, the motion was seconded by Jacob Pacala, motion carried.

Streets Allys: The board got bids for removing 4 ash trees in the cemetery, 1 ash tree in mini park, and 3 ash trees in the park which includes taking them down, grinding stumps, and re-seeding from BMF for \$4,500. A motion by Jim Bublitz to approve hiring 8MF for \$4,500 to take down the 8 trees, grind the stumps and re-seed, motion was seconded by Kevin Hankes, motion carried.

Dean reported the county has not got the lines painted on Jackson Street as of yet, they were having issues with the sprayer and will get at it asap.

Dean reported this would be his last board meeting he would be attending with the recent hiring of his replacement Kenneth Hankes, Dean said it was a pleasure working for the village for the last 40 years, and stated he was looking forward to his retirement. The village board acknowledged the 40 years of dedicated service to the village and wishes him all the best in his retirement. The board discussed giving Dean a retirement party, and Dean stated that was not necessary. THANK YOU, Dean Ziegel on 40 years of service to the Village of Reeseville III

A motion by Dave Snow to approve Resolution 2023-2, in support of flashing lights on the east and west bound roads of County HWY K and County HWY I east of Reeseville, the motion was seconded by Jim Bublitz, motion carried.

Community Center report: Nothing to report, there meeting was the following week.

Public Property: Anna Volkova reported we received the bids for lawn mowing, 1. Fritz mowing, 2. Watertown Green, and 3. Nathan Anton.

A motion by Kevin Hankes to accept Nathan Anton for 2 years and starting June 1st, 2023, for mowing and trimming the cemetery and baseball diamonds in field and outfield, the motion was seconded by Jacob Pacala, motion carried.

Rec Department: Anna Voikova is working on getting information for a company in Minnesota and will have more details next month.

The board discussed future agenda items.

A motion to approve paying the bills was made by Kevin Hankes and seconded by Jim Bublitz, motion carried.

A motion to adjourn was made by Jim Bublitz and seconded by Anna Volkova, motion carried.
