





PROCEEEDINGS OF THE VILLAGE BOARD OF THE VILLAGE OF REESEVILLE November 11, 2023

A duly convened meeting of the Village Board of the Village of Reeseville, Dodge County, Wisconsin, was held in open session on November 11, 2023, and called to order by Village President, Brian Miller, at 6:30pm. The pledge of allegiance was recited. Roll call was taken, and the following Trustees were present, Anna Volkova, Dave Snow, Jim Bublitz, Jacob Pacala, Kevin Hankes. Cheryl Goodrich was absent.

Notice of the meeting was given to the public at least 48 hours prior to the meeting by posting the complete agenda at the Reeseville Village Hall, the Reeseville Post Office.

Jim Bublitz made a motion to approve the consent agenda, the motion was seconded by Kevin Hankes, and the motion carried. The village board observed a moment of silence for longtime employee Dean Ziegel.

Public comment: Jessica Becker asked for an update on mailbox/home delivery, Jake didn't have any updates and Jake was waiting to hear back from USPS.

No Engineer Report: Tammy Hampton was present and gave the village board an update on potential funding available for future road projects. Hickory, Park, and Willow would qualify for the local road improvement plan, applications are due December 1, and March 1 we would find out if we were awarded funds.

Police Report: The Dodge County officer was not present for the meeting due to an emergency call; the village board reviewed the police report. The police car was taken in and repairs were done, and a new battery installed.

CLR Report: Eric Howlett was present to give the CLR report, CLR had 206 calls so far in 2023. The stations were lettered and CLR has 50 total fire fighters. CLR is working on finalizing the details for the new building and Eric stated that groundbreaking will take place around the first part of April 2024.

Lifestar Report: No report was available for the meeting. Jim Bublitz stated CLR and Lifestar work very well together.

Library Report: Jacob Pacala gave the report for the library, all the maintenance is done at the library, circulation is up, and Sara Will has quit, so the library is looking for help.

Utility Report: Ken Hankes reported the weigh scale was replaced. The north main lift station transducer is bad and will take 4-6 weeks to get a new one. Well 2 has a new heater and the tank shed up by ponds heat was out and the electrical outlet was corroded, Ken is having Steve (Rhode electric) replace outlet for corrosive environment. Several people have stepped forward to assist Ken in his office since the passing of Dean.

Streets and Alleys: Leaf pickup will start, and Gary Kohn offered to help with the leaves. Jacob Pacala reported they have a meeting scheduled with Specialty Cheese on Wednesday the 15th and will go over several items and will have an update next month.

Finance and Personnel Report: Items A and B were tabled until December. Budget hearing was rescheduled for November 27, 2023, at 5pm. A motion by Dave Snow to approve the new gworks software for \$4,500 and the one-time fee for implementation and onboarding for \$2,000 for a grand total of \$6,500 to gworks, the motion was seconded by Jim Bublitz, the

motion was approved with pending clarification on the standard processing fees for processing payments, motion carried.

Clerk Update: Margaret Schmidt reported there was a problem with sending water and sewer bills via mail in October and about 30 residences never received their bills, so Margaret will send notices out to residents. Margaret reported that all water and sewer bills need to be paid as soon as possible so the books can be balanced before switching to the new system, and severely delinquent accounts were put on the tax roll as a special assessment. Margaret would like to remind residents to update their billing information, PO Boxes are required by USPS. Public health and Welfare: Jim Bublitz reported that Carla Chase from Marshfield Medical Center had reached out to Jim and Carla stated the village will have a contract soon to take over the library building from Marshfield Medical Center. Jim will also work on getting the COM2 recycling contract taken care of.

Public Property: Anna reported on the Barber Shop Plus building and stated we cannot move forward; we are waiting for the legion to give the village possession of the property. Anna reported on the cemetery garage doors, Anna got an estimate from hometown for white steel door for \$4,400. A motion was made by Anna Volkova to accept the bid from hometown for the doors, and installation for \$4,400, the motion was seconded by Jim Bublitz, motion carried. Anna Volkova made a motion to accept Rhodes Electric bid for the electrical work in the DPW garage, the motion was seconded by Dave Snow and the motion carried. Anna reported TRW will call this week when they are coming to clean up the brush pile. The 2 trees in the park that need to be taken down, Joe Chivers will take them down, and will wait until the ground is frozen, Joe will take them down for free and keep the wood. The board decided to replant some trees in memory of Dean Ziegel. A rezoning hearing is scheduled for November 27, 2023, at 4:40pm for 500 South Main Street. The board discussed raising the price on grave opening, Anna will get more information on pricing and have it for the December meeting.

Community Center report: No report available. The fire extinguishers need to be serviced, Jim Bublitz will talk to Hammes Fire and Safety to have them serviced. The kitchen hood at the community center needs cleaning, talk to Denise to have this taken care of. A motion by Anna Volkova to get a set of keys for the community center and any other village buildings to Ken

Kevin Hankes suggested putting the ordinance each month in the Reeseville Review and posting it on the village facebook page, the board agreed that was a good idea, and village residents can also look up the ordinances on the village website.

Future agenda items: Pilot, Electronic recycling, contract from Marshfield Medical and Library, Fitz Lawn Care, Cemetery, Appointment to Community Center board.

A motion to approve paying the bills was made by Kevin Hankes and seconded by Jake Pacala, motion carried. A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Jim Bublitz and seconded by Anna Volkova, motion carried.
